Mark Angelini of Mountain Run Permaculture will explore the principles of ecological design and the techniques that create biologically rich soils, restore water & nutrient cycles, produce nutrient dense foods, medicines, and the low-input farming and gardening methods that regenerate both human and ecological health. He does design, consulting, and education throughout the region and manages Mountain Run Permaculture with his wife, Allison, where they grow apples, fruits, vegetables, herbs and livestock in an integrative system.



Dr. Reza Rafie, PhD

Dr. Rafie is a Virginia State University Extension horticulture specialist. His presentation will focus on ethnic vegetables and niche crops for the small “farmer” or gardener. Dr. Rafie works to bring exotic and current trend produce to Virginia farms and tables. He has worked extensively on growing blackberries, and raspberries in “high tunnels.” He has been working to bring the PawPaw tree back into popularity and has a special interest in growing ginger and turmeric as well as exotic and ethnic fruits and vegetables.



Doug Coffey, CMG



Doug is a Master Gardener focusing on raised-bed gardening, vermiculture and native plants. He has spent the past 10 years acquiring new bearded iris introductions and rescues from other gardens to amass a small collection of nearly 500 cultivars, many historic that date back to the mid 19th and early 20th centuries. He will present a history of this iconic flower that dates to ancient Greek and Egyptian gardens and share “how to” tips on growing, maintaining, and hybridizing flowers that fittingly take their name from the Greek word for rainbow.
